## UNIFORM

We are very proud of our school uniform and we want to thank all families for your support in ensuring the children are wearing it well so far this year. A few reminders for all families:

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## **School fees and Charges for 2023**

School fees at St Patrick's are family fees – we charge only for one child; we do not charge school fees for any other children who are in the school at the same time.

**The basic school fee is \$2,500.00. per annum to be invoiced in full at the beginning of the school year. This is payable by the end of Term 3**

### **Student Levies**

Other charges are made for various activities undertaken during the school year. These levies are per child, not per family. Levies are spent directly on the children's needs for curriculum (texts, art materials, photocopying etc.) excursions, diaries, and Sacramental programmes. As children in each class participate in different activities, the levy is different for each class and is payable by the end of Term 1. Please refer to schedule of levies overleaf.

### **Payment Terms**

All student levies and camp fees must be paid by the end of Term 1.

All other fees are to be paid in full by the end of Term 3.

If your family is leaving the school rebates will be calculated to the end of the next school term. No pro-rata term payments will be issued.

Families enrolling once the school year has commenced will be expected to pay an enrolment fee of \$100 plus any student levies prior to commencing at St Patrick's School. No pro-rata term payments will be calculated. Fees will be charged for the full term of commencement.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

## Student Wellbeing

School connectedness and a healthy and supportive school environment go hand in hand. These protective factors can help students engage in positive health behaviours and avoid multiple risk behaviours, get better grades, and improve mental health and emotional wellbeing.

Parents and families play a critical role, often being the first to help their children develop skills to recognize and manage emotions, establish, and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. When families and schools work together, they can help create a healthy and supportive environment for children and adolescents to learn these skills at home and at school.

**Get involved** in the health decisions at school. Ask to be involved in parent organizations – such as the Parent and Friends Association (P&F) and support their fundraising and social events. Volunteer to assist around the school for special events such as working bees, visual and performing arts shows and if applicable in the classroom for art lesson support or excursions. Support student endeavours at sporting events, attend Monday morning assemblies or come to church as we regularly celebrate Mass as a whole school. Encourage healthy eating habits and support our school's sustainability efforts through our nude food policy.



**Make communication with school a two-way street.** Read school newsletters, make use of the Skoolbag and Operoo Apps and attend parent-teacher-student conferences to learn what is going on at school. Participate in school provided educational opportunities for parents. Communicate regularly through emails, phone calls, or meetings to discuss your child's grades, behaviour, and accomplishments.



**Implement simple strategies at home such as:**

- Take time to talk to your child and be an active listener.
- Acknowledge and ask about your child's feelings to model empathy.
- Focus on your child's strengths before talking about things they can do to improve their confidence.
- Children learn what they see. Model positive coping skills to identify and manage stressful situations. For example, going for a walk or practicing deep breathing exercises can help.

My name is Jen Brown and I am very excited to be delivering the Visual Arts program this year.

The overarching theme this year is 'Be Inspired.' Students will explore the many different ways we can be inspired by art - including through storytelling, through people, places and culture. The Art Show later this year will also reflect this theme.

This term we will be using our artwork and creative expression to complement social and emotional lessons undertaken in the classroom. Our inspiration for this will be through story-telling and using a range of beautiful children's literature to explore values, mindset, gratitude, mindfulness and friendships. Drawing, painting and collage will be central to this term's art focus, before we move onto more complex skills and techniques during the year.

## 2023 Team Vic State Selection Process

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The following is to provide you with information about the School Sport Victoria Team Vic trials for 12 years and under teams in the sports of *Australian Rules Football*, *Netball*, *Football (Soccer)* and *Basketball* for 2023. To be eligible to participate in the trial process:

- **Students must be nominated and endorsed by their school initially.**
- **Each of these children needs to register online, if they wish to proceed.**

Each school is only allowed a maximum of three (3) students for each sport mentioned above to attend these trials so it's important that as a school, we acknowledge the capacity and ability of these nominated students to be able to participate well in these trials. It needs to be emphasized that these trials form part of School Sport Victoria's Gifted and Talented program and are not 'come and try' opportunities. Each child is trialling for a State Team and as such we must attest to each child's athleticism, elite skill level, previous high level achievements in a particular sport and their school behaviour.
