NAPLAN

NAPLAN testing will occur over the next two weeks for Years 3 and 5. NAPLAN tests the skills that are essential for students to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy.

It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress.

NAPLAN is now completed online for all students in Year 3 and 5 with the exception of Year 3 Writing which will be completed on paper. The NAPLAN assessment for our students will be conducted at the following times:

Mathematics

INCLUSIVE LEARNING APPROACHES IN MATHEMATICS

Mathematics is a subject that can sometimes be perceived as either inaccessible or boring, which can in turn lead to students feeling disengaged and disinterested. This is particularly true both for students who may face barriers to learning (such as those with disabilities) and for high-performing students who are seeking extra challenges. However, inclusive learning approaches in mathematics can help to break down barriers and create a more positive and engaging learning environment for all students.

Inclusive learning approaches in mathematics are characterised by a focus on student-centred support and whole-class engagement in challenging tasks. By creating a learning environment that is both motivating and accessible to all students, these approaches help to foster a sense of belonging and connection to the subject. This, in turn, can lead to increased student participation and a more positive attitude towards mathematics.

Enabling & Extending Prompts

As part of our inclusive learning approaches at St Patrick's, we provide enabling & extending prompts within our mathematics lessons. Once we identify that a student is either struggling or needs additional challenges within the lesson, we seek to provide that student with enabling prompts (to help make the activity more accessible) or extending prompts (to help students focus on more complex aspects of the maths being covered). This is in contrast to more traditional methods of mathematics education (sometimes labelled "ability grouping"), wherein students are given totally separate activities that are either "easier" or "harder" (and thereby excluded from the common language,

Qustodio Parent Cyber Safety App

The way in which young people use technology has shifted significantly with children spending more time than ever online. This paradigm shift presents many new challenges not to mention an increase in online risks and threats.

We at St Patrick's take our students' digital safety and wellbeing very seriously as a school. We continually look at ways to ensure that we can be proactive to ensure children remain safe online at all times

Our existing <u>St Pats Online Safety Hub</u> is an excellent resource for parents with tips and advice on all cyber related topics. This is all thanks to our strong partnership with Linewize. The technology that Linewize provides protects more than 12 million students and now includes a parental child safety app from **Qustodio**. Qustodio gives you visibility of how your child is engaging online on their home device.

As a parent, you will have the ability to:

- Pause the internet on your child's device from your app
- Receive reports of your child's online activity
- Apply filtering rules
- Get access to online safety expert advice directly through the app.

We are offering you the option to protect **two** personal devices (phones, shared iPads, etc.) per family free of charge. This will reassure you as a parent that your child is safe whenever using this device; while preventing exposure to harmful or inappropriate content. This will help students focus on learning outcomes and improve their digital wellbeing.

We are aiming to have Qustodio ready for parent use by the start of term 2. More info to come soon.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
