It is one of the highlights of our trip to Canberra as we reflect on those people who gave their lives for their country.

This was part of a full day where we visited Parliament House and saw our Federal member Mr Mark Dreyfus introduce bills to parliament. We briefly met with him until the bells sounded and he had to go back to Parliament to vote. From there we headed to Government House for a tour before we went to the War Memorial and then after dinner we went to the AIS.

The Year 6 students have also visited The National Capital Exhibition, The High Court of Australia, the National Gallery, CSIRO and a quick tour in the evening to Mt Ainslie. This has all been in two days and we have one day to go.

We have been sharing all of our photos with the Year 6 families and we hope they have enjoyed seeing everything that their children have done.

This has been a rewarding and fun trip for our students and we have been extremely proud of how they have represented their families and our school. Having not done this trip for a few years, we had questioned whether it would be something we would continue with, but it will hopefully stay as part of our Year 6 program as it has been a valuable experience for our Year 6 students.


