School Reports- nForma Parent Portal Instructions

Dear Parents,

The St Patrick's School reports will again be accessed electronically via nForma's Parent Portal on **Friday 16th June 2023**. The following are instructions on how you will be able to access the portal. The link to the portal can also be found on the school website homepage.

All families will receive an automated email from no-reply@nforma.com.au. This email will contain:

- The link to access the Parent Portal
- Your username (which is your email address you have provided to the school)
- A temporary password
- Once you have logged in with the temporary password, you will be able to change your password. The password must be at least 7 characters long and include one character that is non alpha numeric. This means that it needs to include at least one character that is not a letter or a number. Examples of these could include a *, or /\$.

If you do not receive an email from nForma, please check your 'Junk' or 'Spam' folder for the email from *no-reply* @*nforma.com.au*

If you are using a mobile device to log into the Parent Portal, please ensure your device is running the latest operating system/software and you have done all the system updates. If problems still persist, please use a computer.







Choc-Coconut Slice

Cinnamon Cream Biscuits 50¢ each



A winter warming soup full of the colour of summer.

Sweet Potato and Lentil Soup

- 1 large sweet potato
 - 2 medium potatoes
 - 2 tablespoons ready-made curry paste (eg: korma, tikka)
 - 1 onion, peeled and diced
- 1/2 cup red lentils
- 1 litre vegetable stock or 2 vegetable stock cubes and 1 litre water 200ml low fat coconut cream
- Chopped coriander for garnish
 - Chapatti or naan bread for serving

Peel and dice the sweet potato and potatoes.

- Heat curry paste in a large saucepan for a minute then add onion and allow
 too cook gently until onion is soft.
 - Add all potatoes, lentils and stock. Bring to boil then reduce to a simmer. Cook for 30 minutes or until potatoes are very tender and lentils cooked.
- Roughly break up the potatoes with a fork. This will also thicken the soup.
 Stir through the coconut milk and season to taste.
- Serve into bowls and sprinkle with chopped coriander and warmed bread for dipping.
