

Here at St Patrick's we use a wide range of tools to assess and educate children in mathematics. One of these tools is *Essential Assessment* and its partner program *My Numeracy*.

Essential Assessment


Your children will already have participated in some *Essential Assessment* tests this year; we teachers use these as both pre-tests (to help decide what children need to learn next) and post-tests (to measure the effectiveness of mathematics lessons). Each test is linked to the topic(s) we are covering in the classroom each week and teachers set the appropriate test levels to suit each child's needs. Whenever a student completes one of these tests, they are automatically assigned a series of individualised online maths activities through the *My Numeracy* program.

My Numeracy

Each *My Numeracy* activity is based around a specific mathematical skill. When a child struggles to demonstrate that skill during an assessment, then the relevant activity is assigned to their *My Numeracy* account. Students can

access this program both at school and at home using the login details provided by their teacher. When a child logs in to *My Numeracy*, the first thing they see will be this screen:

To find their next activity, students need to click on the yellow play icon at the bottom of the screen.



They can then select one of the available activities on their screen. When they enter an activity, students will be presented with a video explaining some skills and strategies they can use in this activity. To move on to the activity itself, students can click on the blue arrow at the top-right hand side of the screen.



They will then be asked to complete a number of questions on that topic. For students who need assistance with reading instructions, there is a speaker icon to the left of each question (make sure the volume is turned up to use this). There is also a "learn" button on the right of the screen, to allow students to re-watch the learning videos as needed.

As students complete each question, they will receive real-time feedback on their answers. Changing the level of activities (or resetting them so that students can have another try) is a simple process that teachers are happy to complete during the week as needed.

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional

 level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools

· consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools

 develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS): Monday 28 August – Friday 15 September 2023

Throughout each year, we pause to listen to our students, families and staff to gauge how our learning community is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as effective school communities and is backed by evidence-based research and best practices.

A significant and formal way in which we engage and gather data is through **MACSSIS**, the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys.

MACSSIS is a set of surveys that have been built specifically for Catholic schools in Melbourne by the Learning Services team at MACS, in partnership with researchers at Learning First and in wide consultation with principals in our schools.

In 2023, students, families and staff are invited to participate in MACSSIS via our secure and purpose-built online platform. The online platform is where our school leaders will access the summary reports that visualise the results of the student, family and staff surveys.

The MACSSIS survey platform is operated by an independent supplier, ORIMA Research Pty Ltd. The platform meets with the high security and privacy standards for handling student and school data. Participating schools are in the process of updating their privacy policy to ensure school communities are fully informed and protected.

Students in Year 4-6 at our school will be provided with supervised sessions, where teachers are on hand to help and answer any questions. Families and staff can complete the survey anytime over the three-week window via an emailed link and password. Feedback has indicated that previous surveys were completed across a range of mobile devices and different web browsers. Schools will be providing more information about MACSSIS throughout Term 3, via newsletters and social media.

Our community's opinions are critical to understanding how our school is performing – MACSSIS is a key data source for guiding the ongoing work to improve our school.

All participation is invited, welcomed and 100 per cent voluntary. The surveys are not a test; they are an inclusive way to support the work we are already doing to improve our school. Everyone has the right to refuse to participate, or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during or after completion of the survey. Please notify the school if your child does not wish to participate.

This letter is to advise you of the civil works project for Mitchell Street, Mentone. The work is being completed by VCrete Contractors under contract for our client Kingston City Council. You are a recipient in this letter drop as a motion of courtesy as we believe the works may affect you in some way. Information regarding the works is as follows.

Location of Works: Mitchell Street between Warrigal Road to Roger Street

Description of Works: VCrete Contractors will be reconstructing Mitchell Street. This project will include drainage upgrades and reconstruction of the road, kerbs, footpaths and crossings.

Working hours between are between 7am – 5pm weekdays and 7am – 1pm Saturdays if necessary.

Commencement Date: Monday, 31st July 2023 Estimated Completion Date: Late August/ Early September 2023 Estimated Concrete Pipe Delivery Date: Between the 25th to the 28th of July 2023

Special instructions:

Stages of Mitchell Street will be under traffic control during construction such as road closures and speed reductions. Some traffic control setups will remain overnight such as bollards and speed reductions. Mitchell Street will remain open to local traffic so that you will have vehicle access to your properties whenever possible.

Concrete pipes will be delivered and stored on the nature strips during Tuesday 25/7/2023 to Friday 28/7/2023. During this period, we would ask you please avoid parking your vehicles on Mitchell Street between Warrigal Road to Roger Street.

During construction, there will be times when you will not have vehicle access to your properties (such as when vehicle crossings are reconstructed or when we are digging a drainage trench in front of your property). To be safe, we advise that you park your vehicles outside of your properties on adjacent streets if you wish to use them. Vehicle access to properties will always be restored at the end of each working day except for when concrete has been poured and is still too fresh to be driven on.

On-street parking will be restricted on Mitchell Street between Warrigal Road to Roger Street so please park on adjacent streets.

Pedestrian and student safety is of utmost importance to us and we will ensure that the worksite is made safe for the public.

During this period, there may be traffic delays on Mitchell Street. There will also be noise disruptions from construction activities. As the work progress towards your property, there will be times where you will be unable to park on the road. We assure you that we will endeavour to minimise the adverse effects onto the public as best we can. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience that you may incur.



WHAT IS A'BEST-BEFORE' DATE?

A 'best-before' date is the last date the food is expected to retain all of its quality, provided it has been stored according to any stated storage conditions and the package is unopened. Quality includes things such as colour, taste. texture, and flavour, as well as any specific qualities that you make express or implied claims, such as the freshness of the food. A food that has passed its 'best before' date may still be perfectly safe to eat (dependant on the elapsed time since it passed this date), but its quality may have diminished.

WHAT IS A'USE-BY'DATE?

A 'use-by' date is the last date a food can be safely eaten, provided it has been stored according to the stated storage conditions and the package is unopened. After this date, the food should be disposed of and not be eaten for safety reasons.

WHAT FOODS NEED A DATE MARK?

Generally, most food for retail sale requires date marking, with some exemptions. Exemptions for labelling can include where a 'best-before' date is greater than two years, a package has a surface area less than l00cm² and food packaged in the presence of customers (eg: lollies, cupcakes, del meats, pies etc).
