# Minor change to morning drop off procedures

From the start of Term 4 we will be reverting back to our previous procedure (Prior to COVID) where parents and students will remain outside the classrooms, on the

basketball courts, before the morning bell. This is to enable the classroom teachers to be fully prepared for the day whilst fulfilling our legal requirements with the latest enterprise bargaining agreement between MACS (Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools) and the IEU (Independent Education Union) where staff should be following the 30/8 model for working hours. By staff using this extra 15 minutes per day (1 hour and 15 mins per week) it will reduce the need for the school to fund time in lieu days for the staff who are over hours.

The new morning process from Term 4 will be as follows:

8:30am - Gates open as usual and students and parents are to remain on the basketball courts/asphalt area during this time. Students place their bags in their regular line up places. Students are not permitted to play large ball games but can play downball/chasing games. An additional senior staff member will also be on duty during this time to assist with supervision.

8:45am - The bell will ring as normal and class teachers will collect the students from their outside lines ready to begin the day.

If it is raining before the morning bell, then the students will be directed inside earlier than the outlined schedule above.

My thanks for your assistance with this necessary procedural change.

# **RECONCILIATION: YEAR 2**

Two important dates to remember for Term 4.

**Tuesday 10th October** @ **3.30pm** The Year 2 students will share their learning on the importance of Reconciliation and what it means to forgive as part of their preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

### **Tuesday 17th October:**

**2.45pm:** A whole Year level prayer service as part of the final preparation for the students to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. **ALL PARENTS AND CARERS ARE WELCOME TO ATTEND.** 

**4.45PM: RECONCILIATION.** In week 1 of Term 4 bookings for Reconciliation for open. Reconciliation will start at 4.45pm and 5 minute slots will open. Please place the name of the student in the available slot. At this stage two priests will be available for the Sacrament.

Children making their First Reconciliation will be receiving a Sacramental Stole. This stole is to be worn over the shoulders for your child's First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation. They will be receiving patches to be ironed onto the sash prior to each sacrament.

Please collect your child's stole from your class teacher before or after school over the next week. **We will not be sending them home with children.** You will need to:

- Iron the first reconciliation badge on the left side of the stole (left side for the student as they are wearing the stole). Instructions come with the badge.
- Add your child's first name to the right side of the stole; how you do this is your choice, you may like to get it embroidered, sew letters on or use fabric markers.


We ask that completed stoles be returned to school by Tuesday the 10th of October.





